PORTLAND. This course seeks to provide an understanding of contemporary corporate ethics and spirituality issues using the theology of stewardship, covenant and marginality within the framework of the legal and historical evolution of the modern corporation.

- PTP1729p Practicing the Scales of Joy** Garabedian, Nash Bujnak, Lynn L
PORTLAND. The poet W.H. Auden once urged his readers to "practice the scales of rejoicing." To that end, this experiential course will use the urban landscape of downtown Portland, Maine to help students delight in the encounter with the Holy One through the practice of various spiritual disciplines. In addition to exploring practices, the use of music, art, and hospitable work will be explored. Visits with working artists and musicians will be used to enhance the experience.
